M. Ministry that Matters

Describe who you believe your neighbors are and tell us what God is currently doing with and through them (your neighbors) that is transforming your community. We have a challenge in that "Chugiak-Eagle River" is a mostly non-defined suburb stretching from Muldoon Road in Anchorage all the way up to Peter's Creek and we have members who come from Anchorage, Wasilla, and Palmer. We are directly assisting our neighbors with Forest Park Mobile Home Park, helping keep them from homelessness, and have a long history of working with Recycle for a Reason. We are transforming the community by welcoming a homeschool group and multiple sports teams to our space.

NEW: Tell us about your new neighbors or the new connections you have made in your community in the last year?

Recycle for a Reason is a growing edge here. As the number of church members we have has declined, we have relied upon those outside of our congregation for ministry. The connection with the homeschool and parents is another new connection. We were instrumental in supporting the homeschool to move to a nonprofit model.

As a congregation, where do you believe you have already been invited, or are now being invited, to be a partner with God in making an impact in this transformative work in your neighborhood/community?	Forest Park is ongoing with a new invitation to help residents with financial management basics. LOVE INC is a growing edge as that organization is undergoing changes and we might see an avenue for increased involvement. There are new avenues for reaching out to JBER and military families.
What key partnerships (outside of your local church) do you currently have or would like to have? Describe the partnerships.	The Ministry Network in the area is being revitalized with our Pastor as part of the leadership of this organization. We have a developing relationship with Chugiak High School and an ongoing one with the local food bank.
What role has your pastoral leader played in enabling the congregation to see and speak into this invitation and your community partnerships? Role of Laity?	This is a strength of our current pastor; community involvement, missiona theology, local mission engagement.

Members and Friends of The United Methodist Church of Chugiak,

When I came to Chugiak in 2021, I came with two kids starting high school and a spouse just starting work at a new school in Anchorage. I think the sense from the congregation was that I'd stick around for at least four years, particularly since I'd been at Seward and Moose Pass for 8 1/2 years and Girdwood for 12 1/2 before that.

I like to plant myself firmly in the places where I live. Theologically, we talk about this as "incarnational ministry" — really moving into an area as God did by becoming human.

I like to "bloom where I'm planted." I like to stick around. I like to be involved. I like to make a difference. I like to have relationships. I hope you get that sense from my time with you so far and feel that I'm fully engaged here.

I do confess that all the work leading up to General Conference 2024 felt like it pulled me away from local church work. While I think that General Church work is important, there are times I felt like I was giving UMCC whatever attention was left over. For that, I'm sorry.

But, in my mind, this will not be forever known as "The Year of General Conference." Instead, it will be "The Year of the Parsonage Roof." This moved from a \$40,000, two-month job to a \$70,000, four-month ordeal. The Doepken family will be happy to have their home and yard back. And Steve Lambert, Dave Wentz, and all the various volunteers will be happy to have their time back. And it had to be done.

With that (mostly) behind us, the most important thing on our plate is our "WE'RE HERE FOR GOOD" Capital Campaign. Our deferred maintenance has caught up with us. The parsonage roof became an immediate need after some water leaked last winter. And our HVAC system has made the temperature of our rooms a problem for user groups. With current financial realities, this is going to be quite a stretch for us. Yet this is needed if we're going to be doing good, for good.

In the midst of this all, Sunday School is going on, we do have new faces joining us for worship, and Recycle for a Reason is going strong. We have some stuff that's working well.

I continue my work with Forest Park Mobile Home Park (with their new planned name "Bear Mountain Estates") and am in dialogue with them about running a Financial Management Class. I am the secretary of our local Ministry Network and am taking the lead on better communication and coordination among churches and ministries. And I know that having two graduating seniors next spring will shape much of our year.

We have a lot going on. But I hope to stick around and work through it with you all.
